**Five Lecture Series Begins October 10**

Beginning in October, this season's MAM Morning Lectures will present five sessions by Miami-based architects and scholars, focused on major figures in 20<sup>th</sup> Century architecture. The series will illuminate everything from the history of modernist architecture and its aspirations of rational design producing a rational society to the most current directions in architecture.

Prior editions of **MAM Morning Lectures** explored the foundational artists of modernism and the history of photography.
