MAM IN THE CLASSROOM - FREE

9am – 1pm Monday through Friday

The Museum's professional gallery teachers, artists themselves, can visit your classroom with a work of art and engage students in observation and a lively discussion. Classroom visits include an activity and last approximately one hour. Interdisciplinary, post visit materials are provided for the teacher. In addition, Miami Art Museum can visit schools on **Career Days** to talk about museum and related professions.

SCHOLASTIC ART AWARDS AND EXHIBITION

January 23 – February 13, 2011

In conjunction with Miami-Dade County Public Schools, MAM hosts the Scholastic Art Awards and Exhibition each year. The exhibition showcases the best work of young artists in both public and private schools. Students, teachers, families and friends celebrate the awards on the Cultural Plaza. Winners go on to compete at the national level.



MUSEUM VISITS - FREE

10am & 11:30am Tuesday through Friday

Miami Art Museum's lively, interactive museum tours for kindergarten through twelfth grade students form the centerpiece of MAM & Schools. These inquiry-based tours are designed to develop an understanding of modern and contemporary art while encouraging self expression at every grade level. Tours foster observation, analysis and interpretation, complementing school curriculum and promoting the critical thinking skills emphasized by **Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT)** guidelines. Led by MAM's professional gallery teachers, visits are approximately **90** minutes in length and culminate in an interactive exercise.

CULTURAL PASSPORT PROGRAM - FREE

10am & 11:30am Tuesday through Friday

This new educational initiative of Miami-Dade County Public Schools will provide students in grades K-12 with a different cultural field experience each school year. Miami Art Museum will welcome third graders from throughout the county. Their museum experience will be linked to classroom instruction.

SELF-GUIDED VISITS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS - FREE

1pm – 4pm Tuesday through Friday

High school teachers may choose to bring their classes to the Museum, on their own, to address a particular area of the curriculum. Please notify education in advance to ensure your trip does not coincide with other group visits. Self-guided visits may take place in the morning but please note museum-led tours take precedence. One chaperone is required for every ten students.

SCHEDULING

Miami Art Museum schedules tours on a first-come, first-served basis throughout the academic year. The Museum can provide **free buses** to Miami-Dade County Public Schools and Non-Public Title One Schools. A minimum of 25 students per bus is required.

Twice a year MAM offers educators free professional workshops designed to engage participants with works of art on exhibition and explore concepts, teaching strategies and interdisciplinary connections. Workshops include private curator-led tours and discussion. Each workshop provides the opportunity to network with colleagues and share perspectives on new approaches to education. **Curriculum Resource Units** are distributed with visuals, background information and suggestions for classroom applications. To participate, teachers must register with MAM prior to the workshop. M-DCPS teachers must also register with dadeschools.net prior to the workshop to receive credit points.
